11:15 AM – 12:00 PM ET	Fireside Chat: The Moment We Are In	This session invites participants into a discussion with Khalil Muhammad, Professor of African American Studies and Public Affairs at Princeton University, where he directs the Institutional Antiracism and Accountability Project. Professor Muhammad will join us to share his thoughts on where we are as a country and why this is such a critical point for children and families. His remarks will be followed by a discussion with CSSP President and CEO, Leonard Burton.
12:00 – 1:15 PM ET	Panel 1: Cash and Caregiving: How Direct Cash Can Complement Other Policies to Support the Care of Young Children	The care of young children is essential work benefiting society for years to come, but families often struggle to afford the care arrangement that works best for them because care is not adequately or effectively supported. In this session, experts will discuss the role of direct cash in supporting caregiving — the need, what we know about what works, and how to scale these policy solutions so that the care families want and need is within reach.

1:30 – 2:45 PM ET	Panel 2: Advancing Meaningful Prevention: Supporting Wellbeing for Children and Families Outside of Child Welfare	Prevention efforts should occur long before a crisis arises for families. In this session, experts will discuss opportunities to provide support to families when they need it, before a crisis occurs.
2:45 – 4:00 PM ET	Panel 3: Supporting Immigrant Children and Families: Meeting the Moment and Building Toward a Better Tomorrow	Immigration enforcement and exclusionary policies undermine the health and well-being of families. In this session, experts will share policy solutions to ensure a future in which all children and families have access to the supports they need to be healthy, safe, and economically secure, along with cross-sector strategies to meet families' urgent needs while mitigating harms in real time.
4:00 – 4:30 PM	Keynote: Our Responsibility to Do The Work	This session invites participants into a discussion with Markita Barideaux, Director of Behavior Health at EMBRACE Perinatal Integrated Care at the University of California, San Francisco. Markita will share what she has learned about what it takes to do work that is rooted in community, and our responsibility in this moment to design and implement policies that are responsive and meet the needs of families.

	Option A From Insight to Action: Building Stronger Early Childhood Systems through Cross-Sector Collaboration and Parent Leadership	Building on decades of experience partnering with communities to improve outcomes for young children, CSSP will highlight lessons learned on engaging parent leaders and cross-sector partners to improve the quality and coordination of services and supports that better serve families with young children and their caregivers.
	Option B Partnering for Impact: Proven Strategies to Elevate Parent and Youth Leadership in Policy Change	CSSP will share lessons learned from co-developing policy recommendations with parents and youth, along with practical tools that partners can adapt to maximize the impact on constituent engagement.

	Option A Applying Developmental Principles in Practice: Using Protective Factors to Support Families and Youth	Using CSSP's Strengthening Families and Youth Thrive frameworks, participants will explore approaches to promote the five protective and promotive factors and leave with a tool to support the factors in their work.
	Option B Advancing Racial Justice for Children and Families: Child Welfare Systems as Part of the Solution	Policymakers and system administrators have a choice to make in how families are served—they can prioritize supporting families early in their communities before a crisis occurs or focus on supporting families after a crisis has occurred, potentially resulting in family separation and unnecessary harm. Building on our work with child welfare systems across the country, CSSP will highlight concrete examples and strategies child welfare systems can implement with their partners to prevent family separation and better support families in their communities.
